	Stone Strong has undertaken a couple of technically very interesting projects in Southland on the Milford Sound – Te Anau Road at Falls Creek on SH94. These were retaining structures built in a quite hostile and aggressive but beautiful Ecco-tourism environment to support the highway from wash-out / slips following storm events. Wet conditions, river management, high seismic considerations, large boulders etc		
	The Stone Strong structures featured combined mass gravity, MSE and GFRP ground anchor tied back walls using no steel in the wall system. Constructed by the Milford Road Alliance partners for this important road access into and out of Milford Sound.
